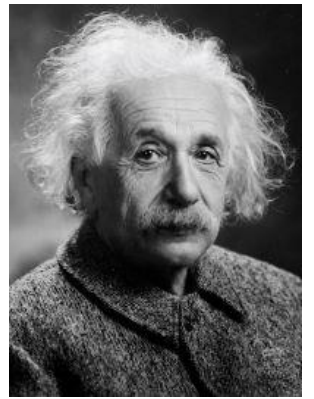


# ALBERT EINSTEIN
